Annual Budget \rightarrow One-year funding for upcoming projects

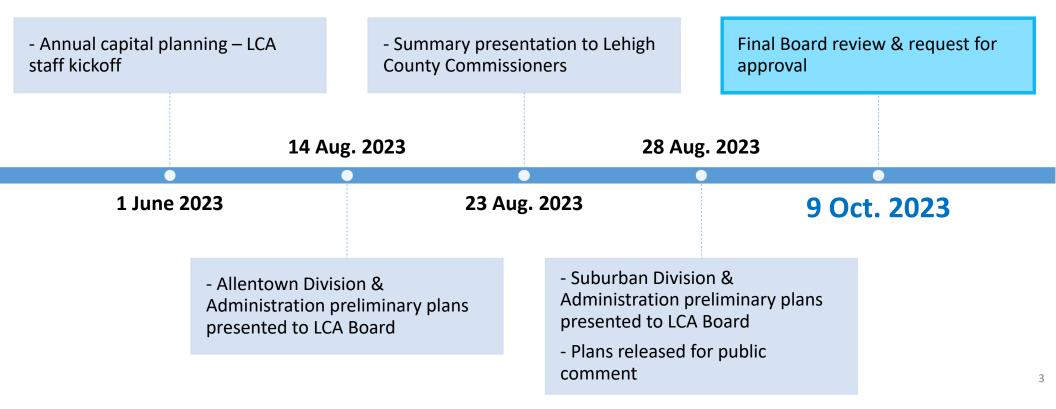


Project Approval \rightarrow Authorization to complete a specific project

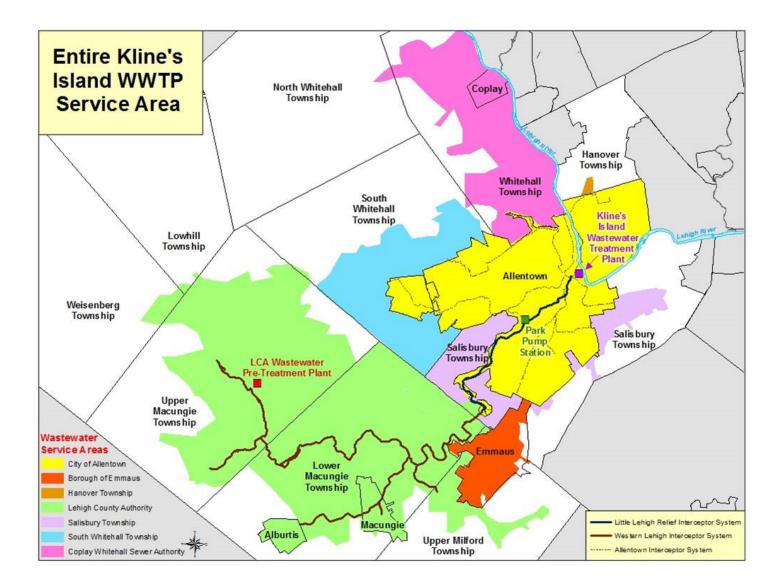

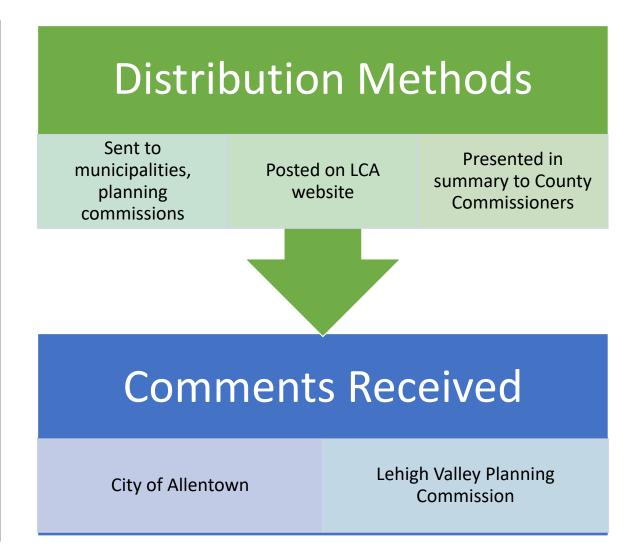

Financial Review – Revenue Increases Required

Suburban Water	3.5 – 5.0% per year
Suburban Wastewater	3.8% per year
Allentown Division	Per Lease*

* During this plan period, the Allentown Water / Sewer Lease Agreement includes rate increases of CPI-U plus 2.5% annually, with additional charges for approved capital cost recovery.
